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**CDX Extends Support for Waste Frame Directive:
Substances of Concern in Products (SCIP) Database Reporting**

Companies using CDX to collect supply chain material and REACH SVHC product substance declarations are well prepared to comply with the requirements of Substances of Concern in Products (SCIP) database reporting. EU product producers & importers will need to begin SCIP database submissions on January 5, 2021. DXC is actively involved with the European Chemical Agency (ECHA) on the technical reviews and validation of a CDX interface to the SCIP database and will be one of the first providers to enable its customers to transfer data collected in CDX to the SCIP database.

What is the SCIP Database, and why it is important for Circular Economy?

The European Chemical Agency (ECHA) is tasked with developing the new SCIP database to collect information on hazardous chemicals. Currently, all supply chain article producers are required to submit product declarations into the SCIP database. The SCIP database will make available product and substance information for waste treatment operators. This information will facilitate product repair, reuse, and recycling while simultaneously reducing chemical hazards, which is the goal of the circular economy.

The database reporting requirements are set forth in the Waste Framework Directive (WFD) and extend REACH Article 33 reporting. The reporting format leverages the existing ECHA IUCLID tool, with further refinement in progress. Initial development of this database has been completed. The DXC CDX team is currently reviewing the format specifications and preliminary SCIP requirements published by ECHA and is preparing capabilities to support our clients with SCIP reporting obligations. DXC will provide CDX with an interface for client-authorized semi-automated upload from CDX into the SCIP database.
